A portion of the gallery are the National Museum, Jos Museum opened in 1952; the National Museum Onikan Lagos opened in 1957; Oron Museum initially opened in 1958 and resumed in 1977 having endured dam-age during the nationwide conflict; National Museum, Benin opened in 1960; National Museum, Kaduna opened in 1975, National Museum Enugu, National Museum, Ibadan; National Museum, Sokoto; National Museum Maiduguri; National War Museum, Umuahia; Gidan Makama Museum, Kano and the Ife Museum. There are additionally exhibition halls in Sokoto, Argungu, Owo, Katsina and Bauchi. There are college galleries at Nsukka, Lagos, Ibadan, Ife and Zaria.

As indicated by Iroham (1986), the area of exhibition halls it directed by the Federal Government's strategy as specified by the National Commission for Museums and Landmarks (Formerly Commission of Museums and Antiquities). These strategies are:

- Where the Government makes a site accessible to the Commission.

There is, for instance a head of Nok itself which is 350mm in level, suggesting a full length of 100mm regardless of whether the head was misrepresented in scale.

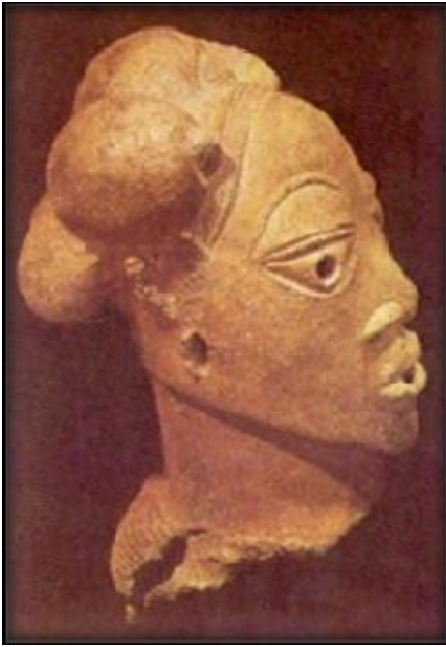


Plate 5: Terra-cotta human head from Jemaa (circa 900 to 200 BC) part of the Nok culture (displayed at the National Museum in Lagos)

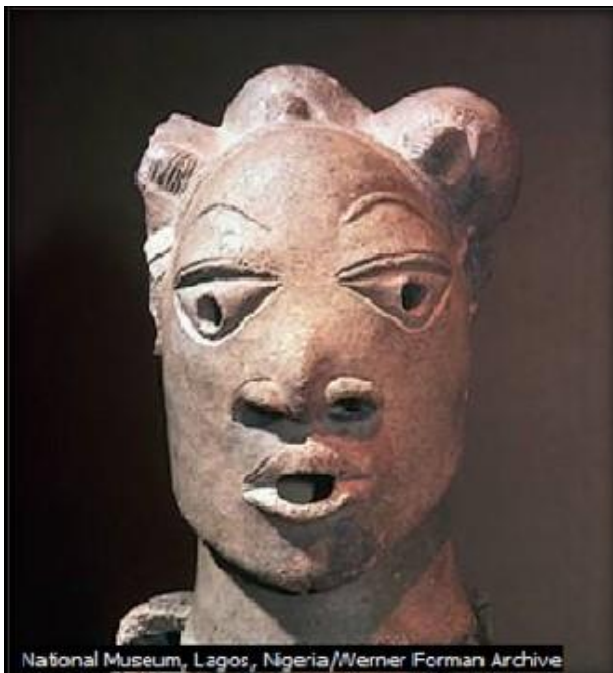


Plate 5: Nok Head, Displayed at the National Museum, Lagos

This earthenware head, estimating 36-cm (14-in) high, was found in the Nok Valley in focal Nigeria. It is ascribed to the Iron Age Nok culture that thrived around here between 500 BC and AD 200. The

head shows adapted facial highlights and presumably had a place with a total figure. It is in the assortment of the National Museum, Lagos, Nigeria.

The Igbo-Ukwu Sculpture

The Igbo-Ukwu expressions are viewed as exceptionally phenomenal bronzes, not quite the same as some other instances of West African workmanship. The town of Igbo-Ukwu lies about (kilometers south-east of Onitsha in Anam-bra State. Dots, tusks, ivory, pieces of material and matting were additionally found.

"The Igbo-Ukwu objects show particular expressive qualities not at all like some other so far experienced" Among these qualities are; profoundly fancy, unpredictable enhancing; bronze duplicates of calabash shapes, normally with one handle and projecting bosses(raised decorative handles); open-work represents the dishes; profound directing on the two bronzes and ceramics, profound scarifications (profound cuts) on hu-man faces. The greater part of these expressions are presently being safeguarded at Lagos and other National Museums. As of now, one can in any case discover a portion of these antiquated fancy works.

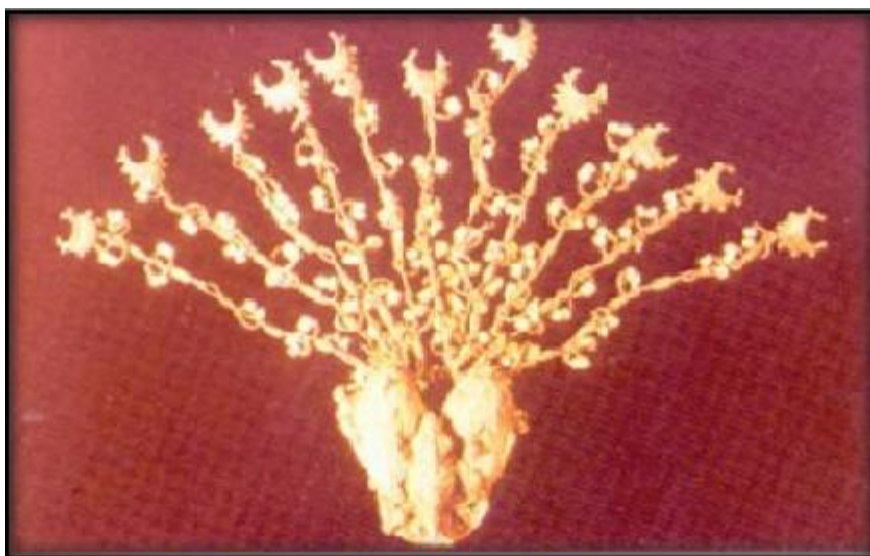

Ife Arts

Ife (or Ile-Ife) has been a significant city for the Yorubas for the years. Ile-Ife has been accepted (as per normal Yoruba legend) to be where life started for the entire world. Oduduwa, one of the divine beings, established Ife and turned into the first 'Oni' the legend says. Its unsure when Ife craftsmanship started to grow however Lagos Museum records show that it was in Ife during the dry ocean child of 1938-39 the fabulous revelation was made of 17 life-size bronze heads along with the top-half of a bronze figure wearing the formal attire of a King. They were found while uncovering earth for building a house at Wunmonije compound simply behind the castle of Oni of Ife. Many heads, both earthenware and bronze are stripped. One clarification of these markings is that they addressed facial scarifications. The craftsmanship style of Ife is portrayed by a romanticized naturalism in both human and creature representation, yet close by this, there is directly through the period when Ife

workmanship prospered, a custom of extreme stylization. Periodically, the two strands are provincial in, for instance, a funnel shaped head with naturalistic highlights.

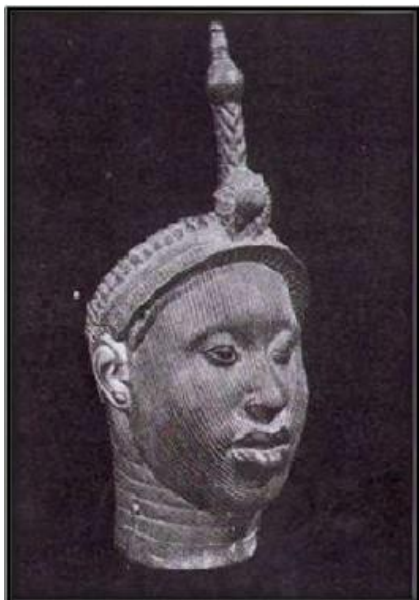


Plate 9 : Bronze head of Olokun, the god of the sea and wealth.

Benin Arts

On January 12 1897, Rear-Admiral Harry Rawson, directing the group at the Cape of Good Hope was selected by the British Admiralty to lead an endeavor to catch the Benin ruler and obliterate Benin City. The activity was named Benin Punitive Expedition, and on February 9 1897 the attack of Benin realm started. The field administrators were told by their president to torch all Benin realm's towns and towns, and balance the lord of Benin any place and at whatever point he was caught. Promptly the British intruders got the city, they started an orgy of plundering and obliteration. It was an activity that was completed by all individuals from the expedition. Landmarks and royal residences of some

high-positioning bosses were plundered and obliterated, lastly on the third day the stole from Benin lord's castle was intentionally set burning. The majority of the plunder was kept by the thieves, and 2500 (official figures) strict ancient rarities, Benin visual history, memory aides and works of art were taken to England. In late 1897 the workmanship was unloaded in Paris, France, to raise assets to pay for the undertaking. The greater part of the Benin bronzes went first to buyers in Germany, yet a sizable gathering is presently in London at the British Museum. The dispersed work of the Benin expressions to galleries all over the planet catalyzed the starting points of a long and slow European reassessment of the worth of West African workmanship[27]. The Benin craftsmanship was replicated and the style incorporated into the specialty of numerous European specialists and subsequently impacted the early development of modernism in Europe.

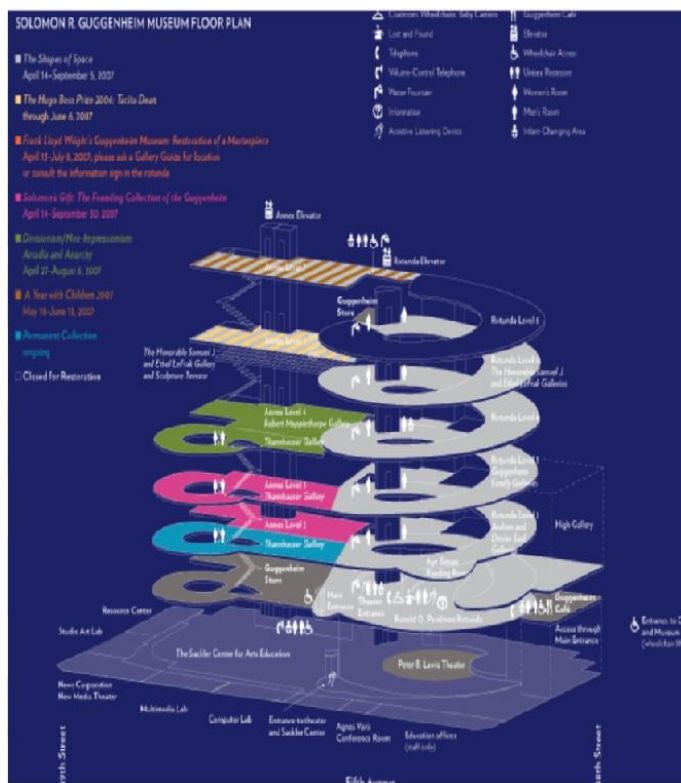

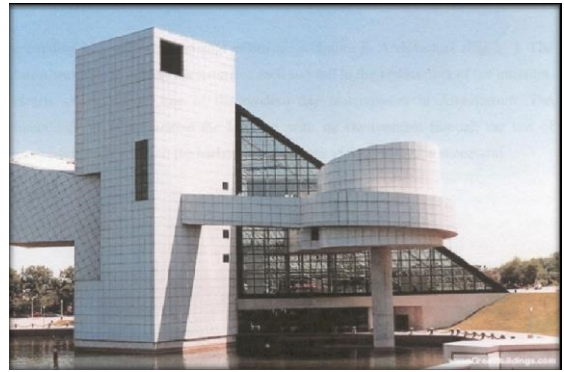
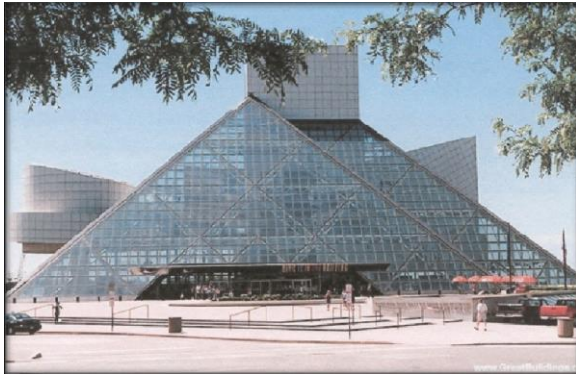

Roles of Museum in Nation Building

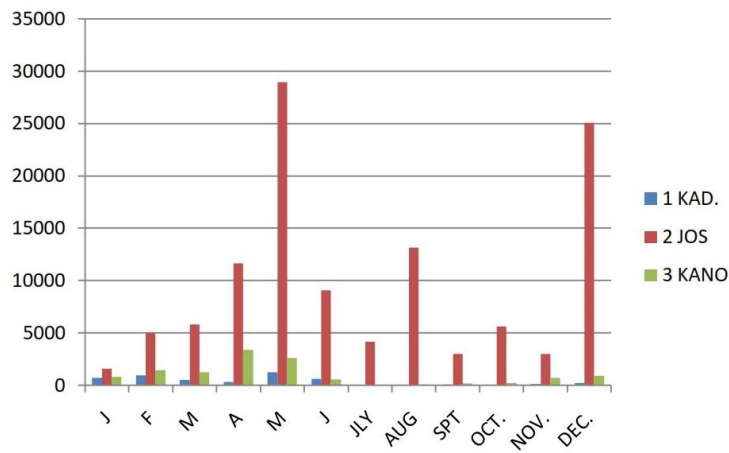

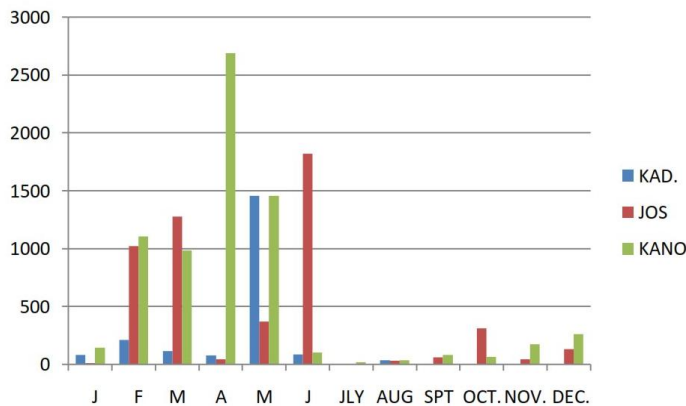

The graph shows annual comparative visitors for total school group visit for the year 2012

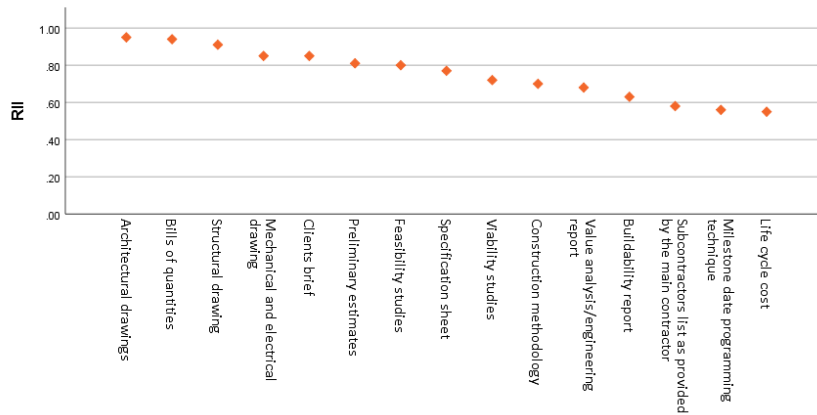

This suggests that construction managers/planners rarely use these tools in planning their project execution and delivery.

Relative Humidity and Temperatures

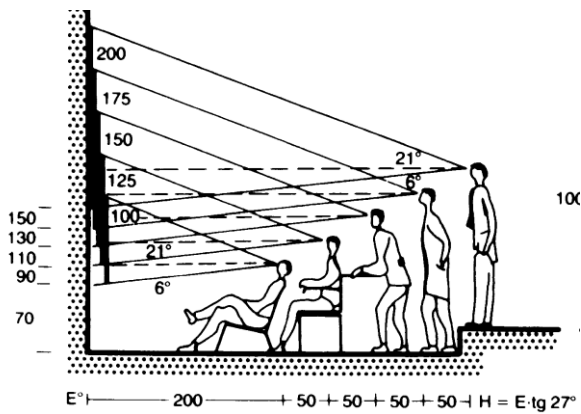


Fig. 18: Field of vision: distance

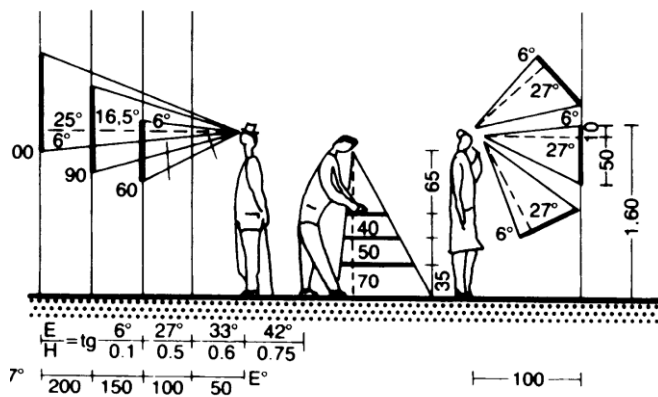


Fig. 19: Field of vision: height size

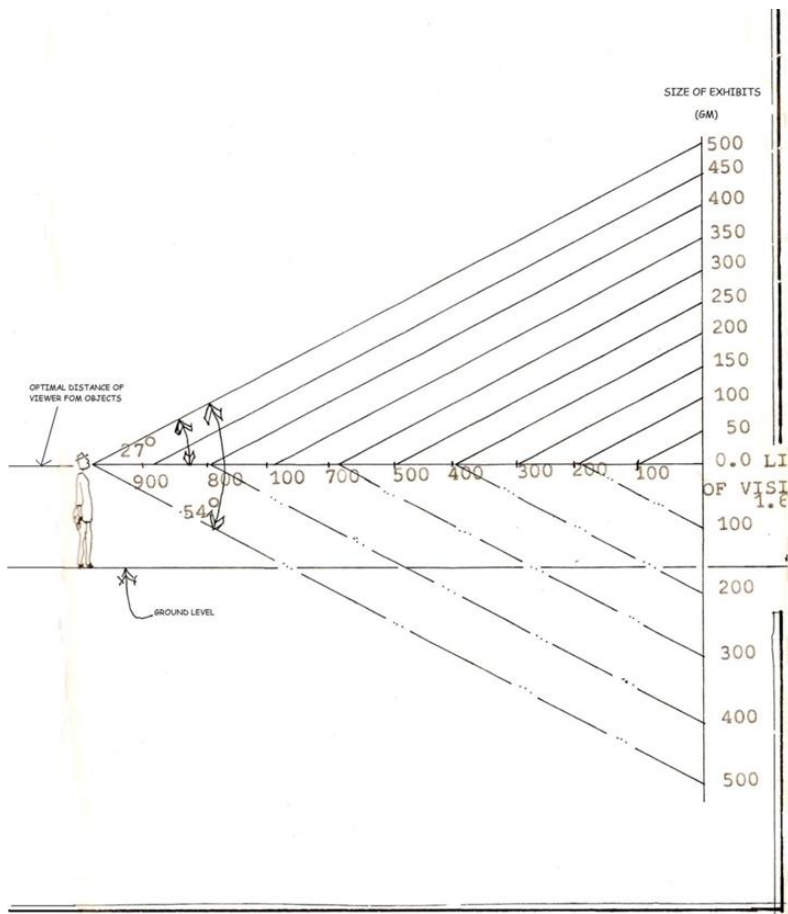


Fig. 20: Viewing distance (object- viewer relationship)

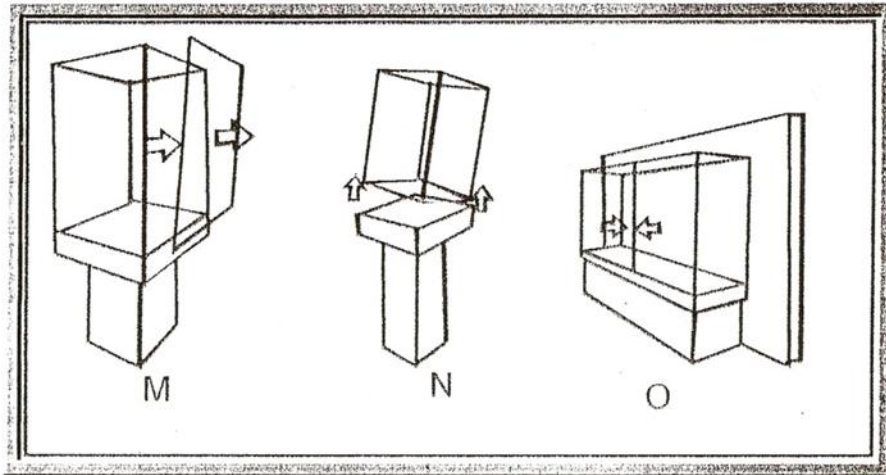


Fig. 21: Types of display cases

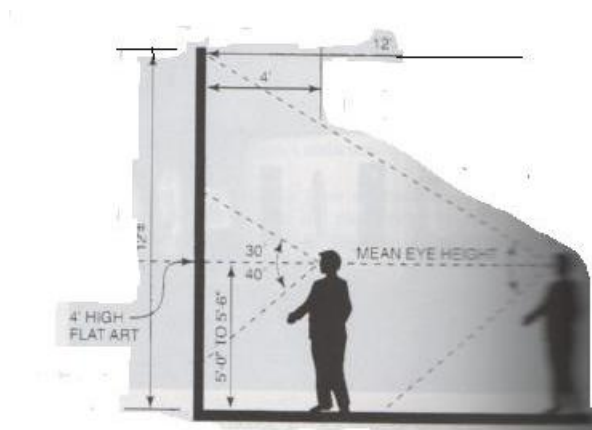


Fig. Viewing distances

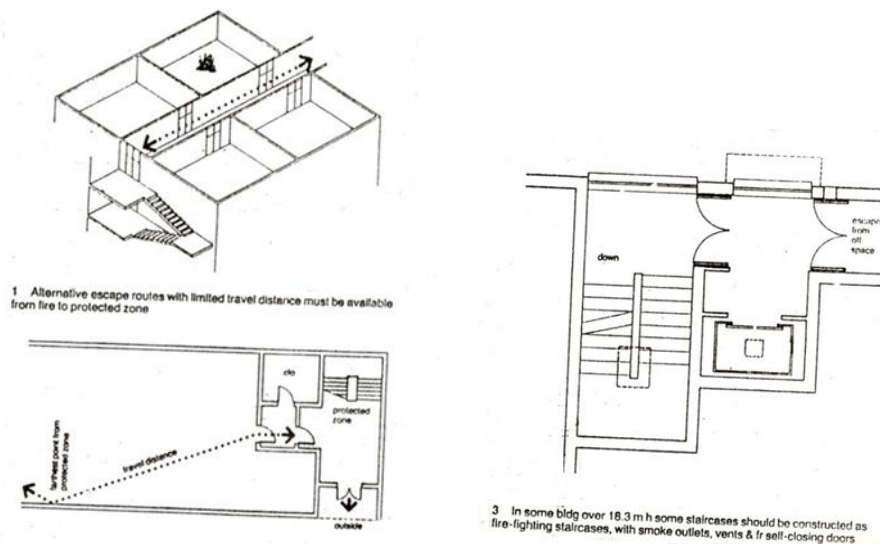

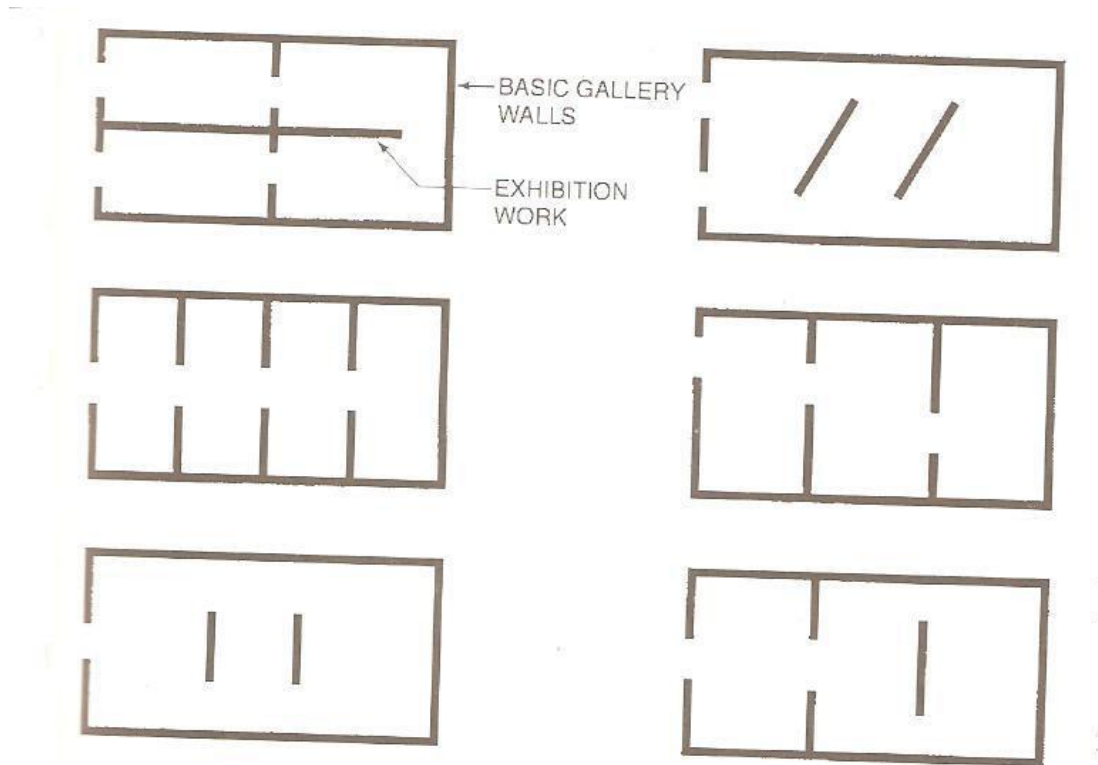


Fig. 7: Exhibition spaces configuration

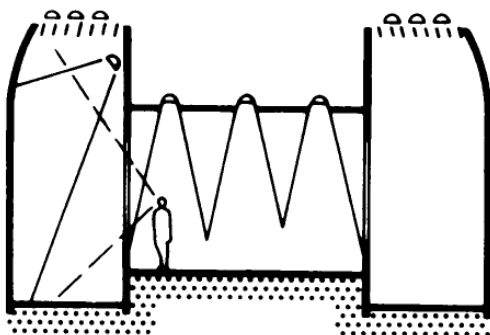


Fig. 8 Cross section of museum of natural history

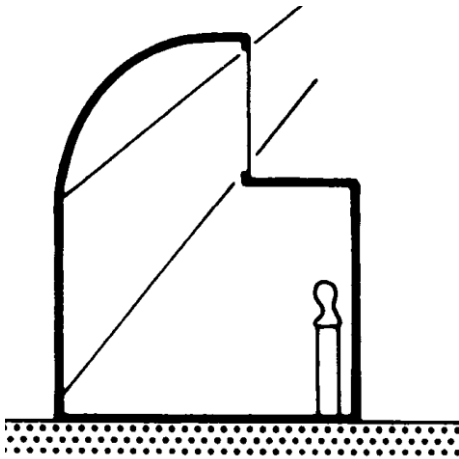


Fig. 9: gallery lit from one side only, lower part with indirect, attenuated lighting

Fig. 10: Lighting installed so that angles of incidence correspond with natural light

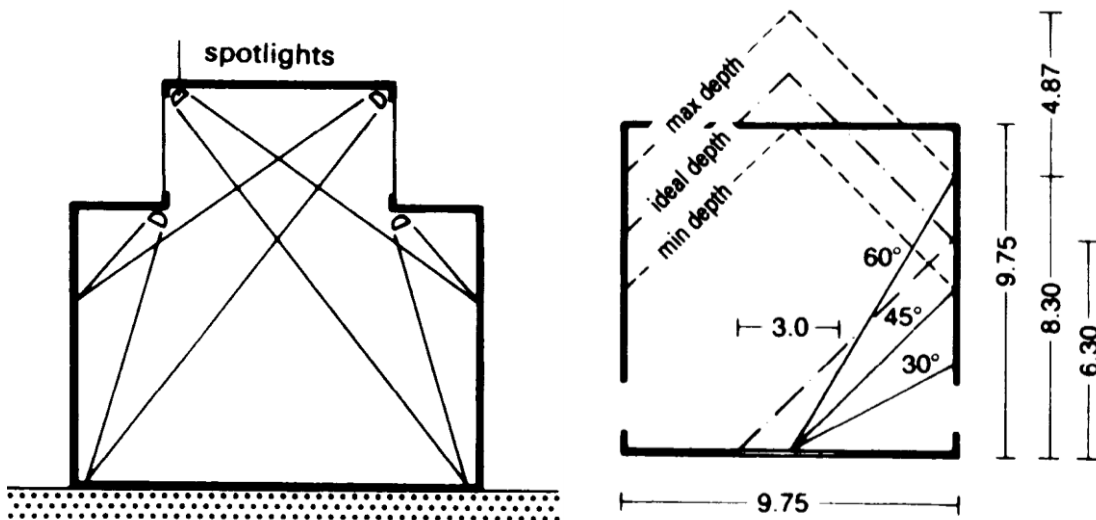


Fig. 11: Exhibition room with side lighting

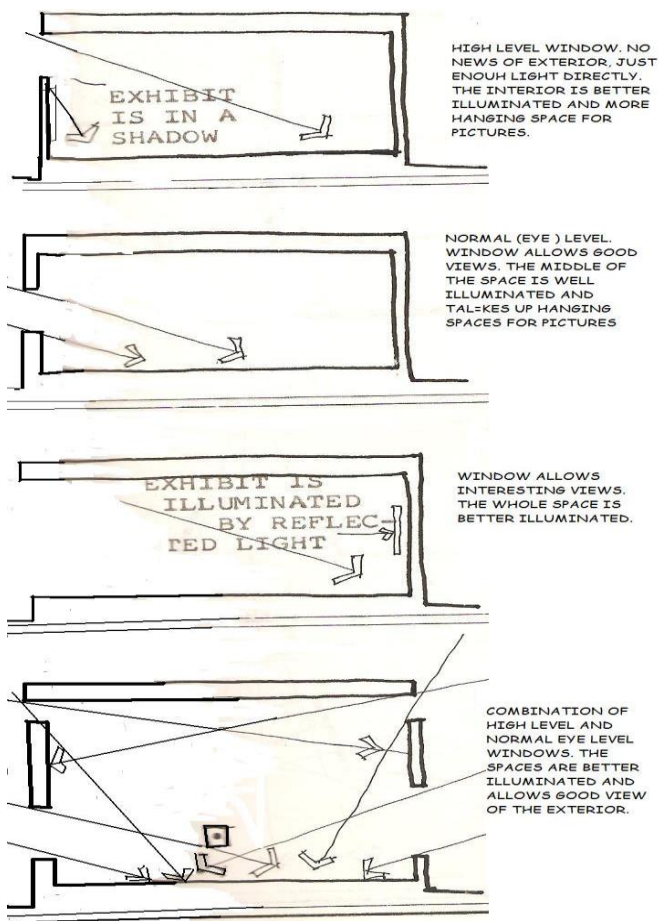


Fig. 12: Horizontal Lighting

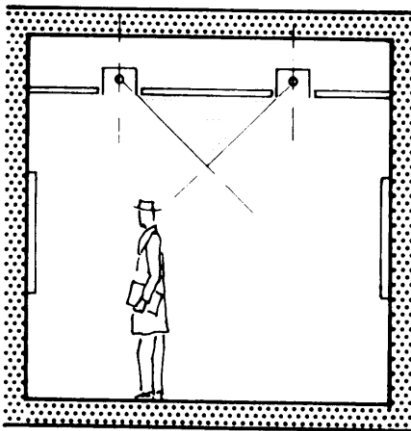

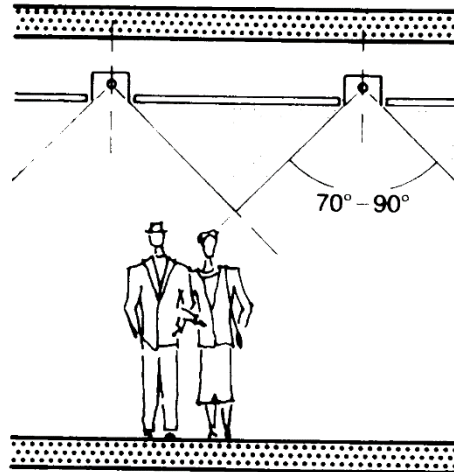

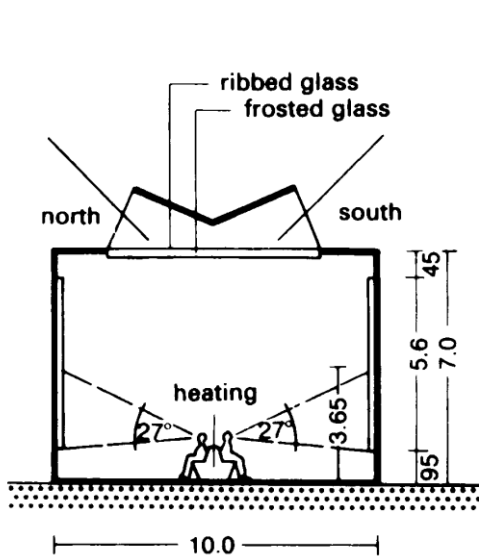


Fig. Well lit exhibition hall based on Boston experience

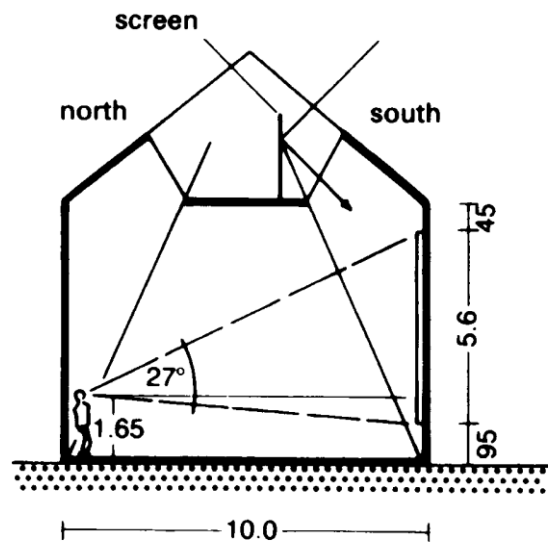


Fig. *Ideal uniform lighting from both sides*

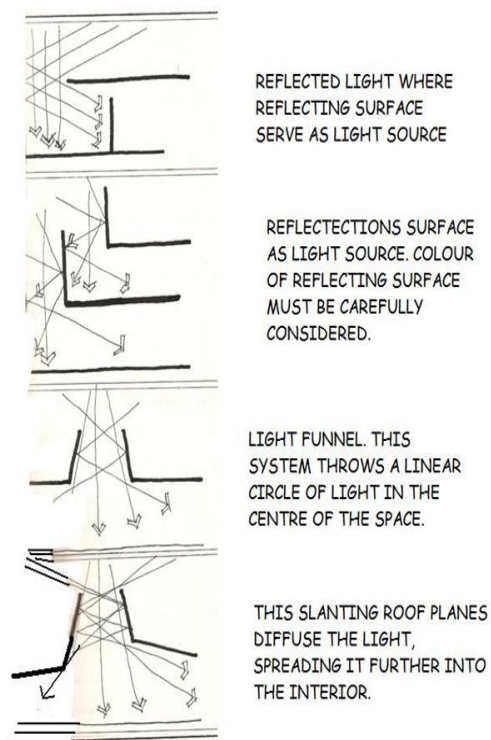


Fig. 16: Vertical Lighting

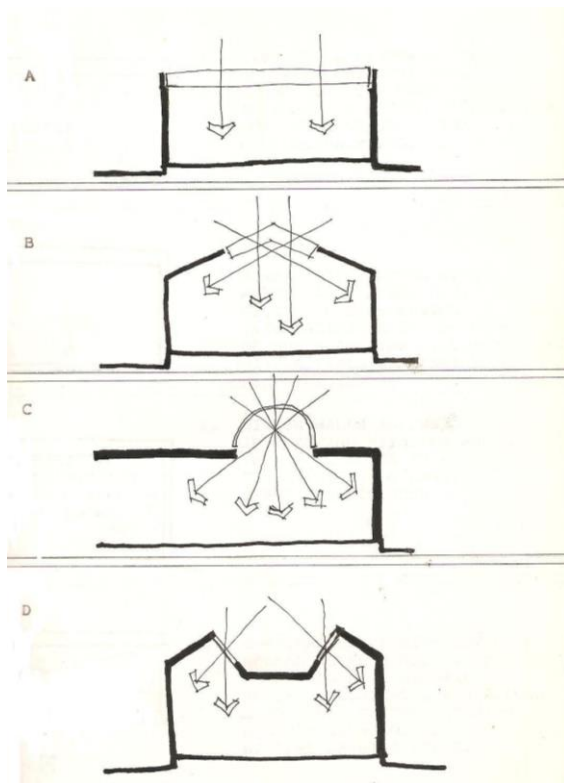


Fig. 17: Top Sky lighting

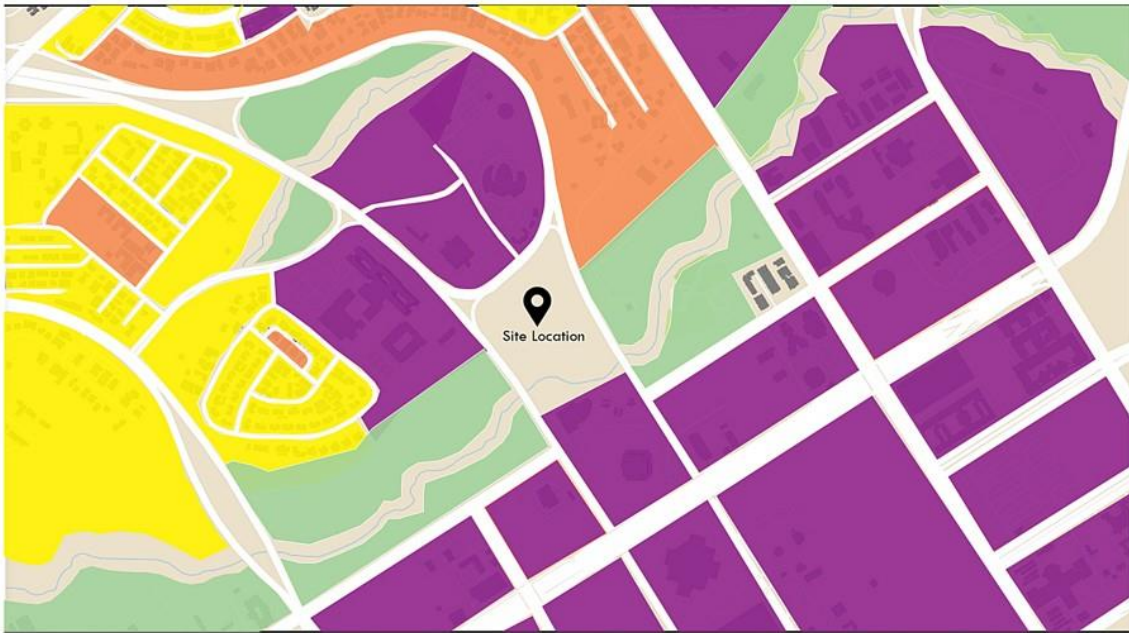

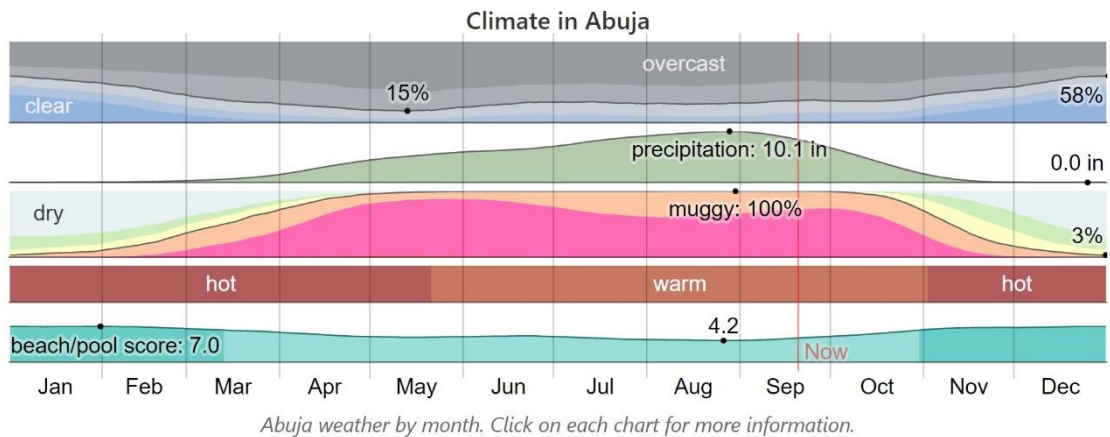
3.3 Detailed climatic condition in Abuja.

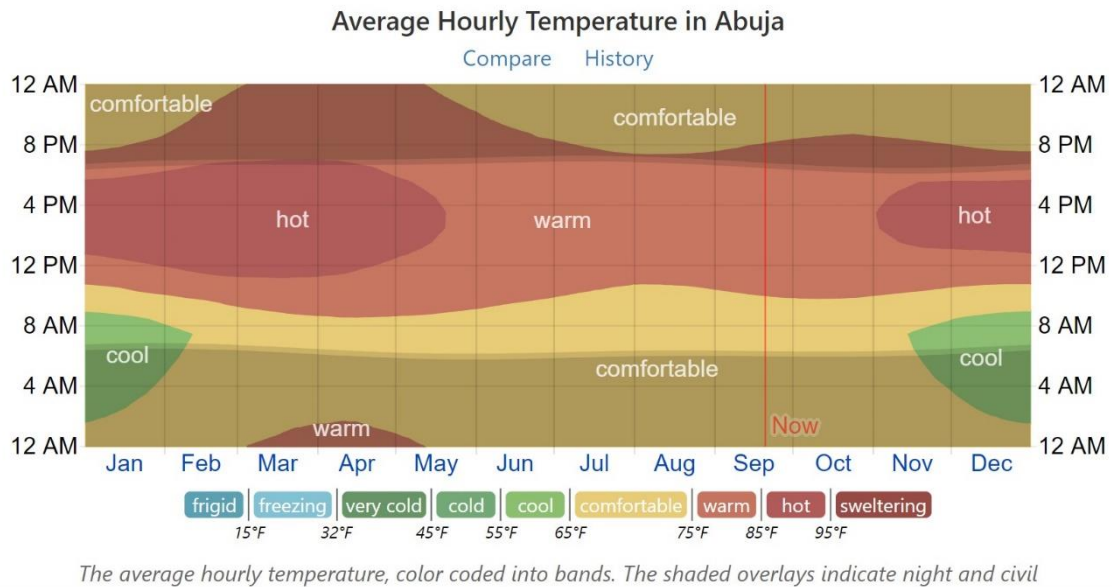
Temperature

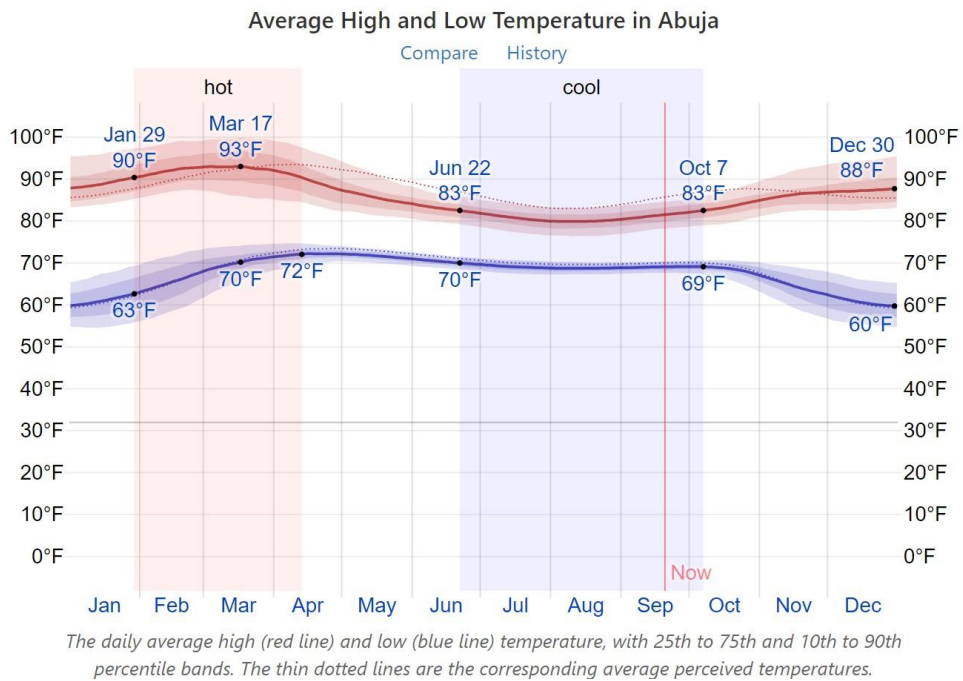


Rainfall and Humidity

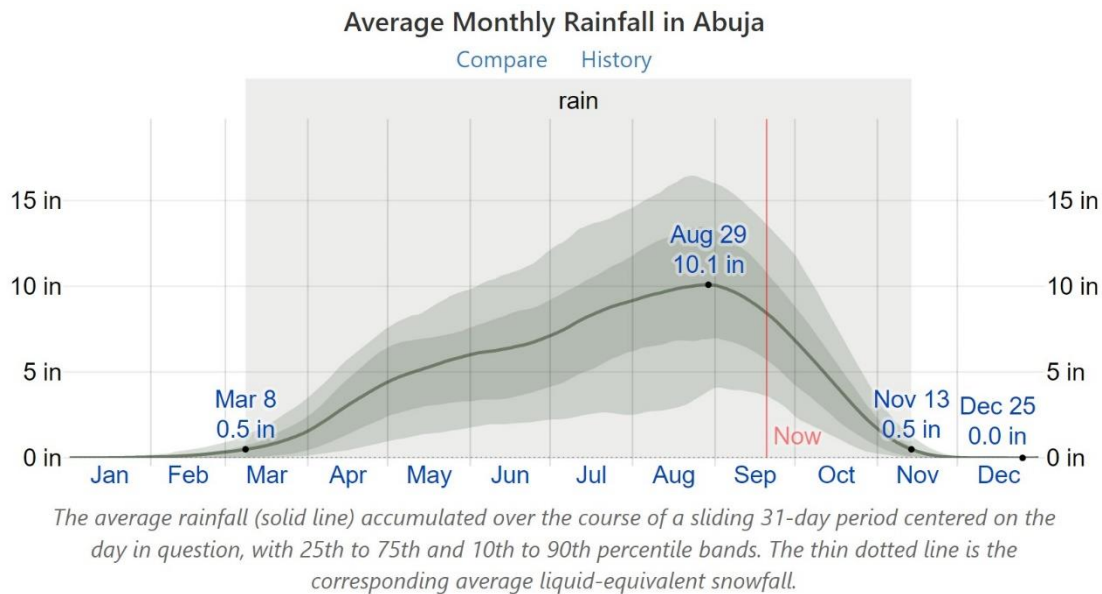

Likewise, just before 2011, one more vehicle blast happened at the Army sleeping shelter, Abuja asserting around four lives and leaving around ten individuals genuinely injured (Attoh, 2012).

Boko Haram are a Nigerian aggressor Islamist faction which looks for political and strict change inside Nigeria specifically the reception of Sharia regulation with convictions situated in the act of Orthodox Islam (Bagaji et al, 2012).

Boko Haram is referred to Jama'atu Ahlis Sunna Lidda'awati Wal-Jihad which in Arabic means as "Individuals Committed to the Propagation of the Prophet's Teachings and Jihad." The gathering which is better realized by its Hausa name 'Boko Haram' was a neighborhood extremist Salafist bunch which changed into a Salafi-jihadist fear based oppressor association after 2009. It is situated in the upper east of Nigeria, in the areas prevailed by the Kanuri public. Inexactly deciphered from the

neighborhood Hausa language, Boko Haram signifies, 'Western instruction or human advancement is prohibited.' Put in an unexpected way, 'Western training or civilisation is a wrongdoing. Boko Haram is an establishment of Al-Qaeda, which has been associated with financing and giving planned operations to them. To that end they are so awful in unleashing devastation in the country without any potential repercussions. He additionally noticed that when the Seal a world class part of the American Marines raged the home of the late Al-Qaeda pioneer Osama Bin Laden in Abotabab, Pakistan last year a few archives were recovered from his home. Among them were letters between Osama Bin Laden and psychological oppressors bunches in Nigeria looking for help. Consequently, he guaranteed them monetary help, preparing and other help. He especially connected them with Al-Qaeda cells in North Africa. To clean this, they at first battled for the establishment of a Shari'a government in Borno State under the then Governor Ali Modu Sheriff, however after 2009, their point was coordinated to the Islamization of the whole Nigeria. This Islamist fanatic order had its starting point from Maiduguri, the capital of Borno State in the Northern area of Nigeria where it was framed in 2002 by one Ustaz Mohammed Yusuf who was purportedly killed on the 30th of July, 2009 by Nigeria security powers in the wake of being taken into custody. In July 2009, he drove a huge scope uprising in the part provinces of Bauchi, Borno, Kano, Katsina and Yobe. Also, 28 cops, 5 jail corrections officers and an undisclosed number of warriors were killed. Moreover, 48 structures had been annihilated, including three grade schools, 12 chapels and a judge's court. On the whole, there were somewhere in the range of 800 and 1 000 setbacks and great many injured, chiefly allies of Boko Haram. Muhammad Yusuf himself was caught and ruthlessly killed in police guardianship. In September 2010, more than 300 Boko Haram individuals went after Bauchi jail and assisted north of 700 detainees with circumventing, including organization individuals who had been kept since the July 2009 revolt (Theo and Soumia , 2012; Onuoha, 2011).

The issue of Boko Haram in Nigeria has turned into a danger to both inward and worldwide security with steadily developing savagery and assaults on security powers, regular people, temples, media houses as well as global bodies like the United Nations. With the expanded quantities of units, improved and complex weaponry, self-destruction bombarding and efficient guerrilla strategies, Boko Haram's test to the Nigerian state currently likewise extends across the whole 36 provinces of Nigeria, hence influence in its financial and social-political development.

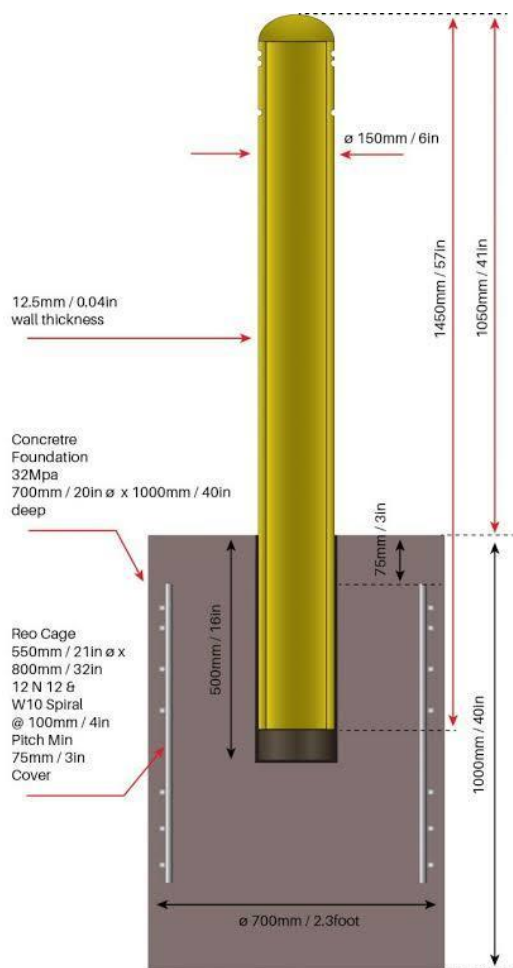
